2023 Detroit CoC Point-in-Time Count



Summary Data Report

The Detroit Continuum of Care (CoC), the Homeless Action Network of Detroit (HAND), and the City of Detroit conducted a one-night Point-in-Time count of persons who were experiencing homelessness in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park on January 25, 2023. The Point-in-Time count (PIT) provides a snapshot of the number of people experiencing homelessness in our community on this one night. This report provides an overview of the data from the 2023 PIT (*No Unsheltered Count was conducted for 2023*).
