

FY2014 CoC Competition Ranking Policies

Eligibility

To be eligible to be ranked by the Detroit CoC in the FY2014 competition, all projects must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Submit their completed renewal application and any additional required documents to HAND by the deadline given in application materials.
- 2. Meet the HUD application deadlines (ie, entry into eSNAPS) set by HAND.
- 3. Projects that were required by HAND to participate in technical assistance processes in previous competition years must be in compliance with all requirements in the projects' technical assistance plan.
- 4. Meet all HUD eligibility criteria, as outlined in the 2013-2014 CoC Program NOFA, the July 2012 CoC Program Interim HEARTH Regulations, and other official documents published by HUD.
- 5. Project must be in compliance with HEARTH Regulations, have received a waiver from HUD, or have a waiver decision pending.

FY2014 Detroit CoC Ranking Policies

Projects seeking FY2014 CoC funding will be ranked in the following order:

- 1. The CoC's infrastructure projects will be ranked first, in the following order:
 - a. HMIS Renewal Projects in descending order of budget amount
 - b. Renewal SSO project dedicated to Coordinated Assessment Model (CAM) in the following order:
 - i. SSO project originally designed for CAM (renewing for 1st time in FY2014)
 - ii. SSO project(s) being redesigned to support CAM in descending order of budget amount
 - c. Collaborative Applicant CoC Planning New grant
- 2. New Permanent Housing (PH) project(s) created via reallocation; which includes PH-PSH and PH-RRH projects in the following order:
 - a. PH-PSH project(s) in descending order of budget amount
 - b. PH-RRH project(s) in descending order of budget amount
- 3. First time renewal Permanent Housing (PH) projects in descending order of budget amount.

- Permanent Housing (PH) projects for which at least 50% of the clients served over the course of the last project term were chronically homeless ranked by project's percentage on the first half (part A) of their project-specific housing performance in the local application;
- 5. All other Permanent Housing (PH) projects by project's percentage on the first half (part A) of their project-specific housing performance in the local application, unless the project did not score at least a 90% on the part A performance;
- 6. All remaining projects not being redesigned or reallocated, including Transitional Housing (TH), Safe Haven (SH), Supportive Services Only (SSO) projects AND any Permanent Housing (PH) projects that scores less than 90% on the part A performance will be ranked together, by project's percentage on the first half (part A) of their project-specific housing performance in the local application.

Project-Specific Housing Performance

"Project-specific housing performance" refers to scored Component #2 of the local application. This component is further divided into 2 sub-components (parts A and B). The specific performance criteria being measured depends upon the project type, as different project types have different housing-focused performance expectations.

Tie-Breaking Criteria

Tie-breakers for the above ranking policies will be applied in the following order:

- 1. First tie-breaker: the *percentage* on component 2B of the project-specific housing performance in the local application
- 2. Second tie-breaker: the *percentage* on component 1A of the project performance in the local application (leaving with source of cash income)
- 3. Third tie-breaker: the project's total application percentage (all components combined)
- 4. Fourth tie-breaker: a project with a larger budget will be ranked above a project with a lower budget

Maximizing Tier 1 Funds

Tier 1 funds will be maximized. This will be implemented in the following way:

- 1. If a project's budget exceeds what is remaining in Tier 1 funds, the project will have the opportunity to reduce its budget down to what remains in Tier 1, and then be placed into Tier 1, thus maximizing the Tier 1 funds.
 - NOTE: The project will not be able to split its budget/project into two separate projects/budgets, and place one part into Tier 1 and one part into Tier 2.
- 2. If this project decides it does not want to reduce its budget to stay within Tier 1, it will be placed into Tier 2 at its full budget amount. This project will then be "jumped" by the next-ranked performing project(s) that will fit into Tier 1. These project(s) will also be given the opportunity to reduce their budgets if needed in order to maximize Tier 1 funds.
- 3. This process will continue until all Tier 1 funds are maximized.
