

2017 Detroit CoC Point-in-Time Count **Summary Data Report**

April 28, 2017

The Detroit Continuum of Care (CoC), the Homeless Action Network of Detroit (HAND), and the City of Detroit conducted a one night Point-in-Time count of people who were homeless in Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park on January 25, 2017. The Point-in-Time count (PIT) provides a snapshot of the number of people who were homeless in our community on this one night. This report provides an overview of the data from the 2017 PIT.
