

2019 Detroit CoC Point-in-Time Count **Summary Data Report**

April 23, 2019

The Detroit Continuum of Care (CoC), the Homeless Action Network of Detroit (HAND), and the City of Detroit conducted a one-night Point-in-Time count of persons who were experiencing homelessness in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park on January 30, 2019. The Point-in-Time count (PIT) provides a snapshot of the number of persons experiencing homelessness in our community on this one night. This report provides an overview of the data from the 2019 PIT.
